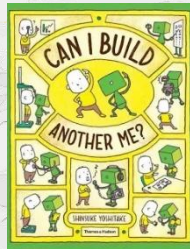
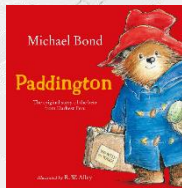
English

In English, we will continue with our Little Wandle phonics program. Children will have 5 phonics sessions per week and three reading sessions per week.

For writing, we will be writing a 3-part story, a set of instructions and a report. We will be basing our writing on the stories 'Paddington' and 'Can I Build Another Me?'

Computing

In our iData unit of work, children will be collecting data and presenting their findings on their own digital graph. In our iLearnAI unit of work, children will learn how AI can be used safely in everyday life. Children will help create prompts for AI to generate a story.

Maths

In Maths, we will be introducing children to the concept of multiplication and division. Children will practise counting in 2s 5s and 10s. In our place value unit, we will move on to looking at larger numbers (up to 100). For fractions, the children will be finding halves and quarters. For geometry and measure, they will be focusing on position, direction, money and time.



Science

In Science, the children will be learning about animals, humans and how to stay healthy. In doing so they will learn about the importance of exercise, eating the right types of food and good hygiene. Children will also label basic parts of the human body. When finding out about different animals, they will learn about herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. Children will carry out scientific enquiries around measuring their pulse, testing for germs and exploring their senses.



History

In History, children will learn about the legacy of Grace Darling. They will be finding out when and where she lived, as well as how her actions highlighted the importance of lifeboats and sea rescue. Children will also find out about the RNLI and why it is so important. Throughout the unit of work, children will explore a range of historical sources, such as medals, newspaper reports and paintings.



Geography

In Geography, our topic is 'What is the United Kingdom?'

Children will use maps to find the names and locations of the four countries and capital cities in the UK. They will then develop their map skills by finding out the names of the seas surrounding the UK, as well as identifying rivers and places that are local to Hartlepool. Children will be able to describe the climate and seasons in the UK as well as talking about the main modes of transport used to move around the country.

R.E.

In R.E, children will be finding out about Hinduism. They will discover what Hindus believe about the deities and Brahman.

The children will have the opportunity to speak and ask questions to a practising Hindu and find out how some Hindus worship both at home and in the mandir.

Music

In Music, we will be using the themes of Superheroes and Under the Sea to explore pitch. Children will carefully select and play appropriate instruments, as well as use body percussion, to help tell stories. The children will also be introduced to simple musical symbols and will be encouraged to think about the pitch, dynamics and tempo of music that they hear and create.



PSHE

In PSHE, we will be focusing on our relationships with others, particularly the relationships we have with our family and friends. Children will learn about how their bodies have already changed since birth and how they will continue to grow. We will also discuss how to keep ourselves healthy and safe.

Art and D.T.

In this unit, children will explore sculpture through looking at a range of artists, including Marco Balich. They will practise folding, shaping and joining paper to make colourful abstract sculptures. Finally, children will design and create their own *Tree of Life* sculpture, inspired by patterns and ideas from different cultures.

P.E.

Children will be taking part in cycling workshops to aid their balance and coordination. During our Rackets, Bats and Balls unit of work children will work on using controlled movements to dribble and hit a ball at a target. They will also take part in some simple ball games. In our Athletics unit, children will explore and develop basic skills such as running, jumping and throwing.
