

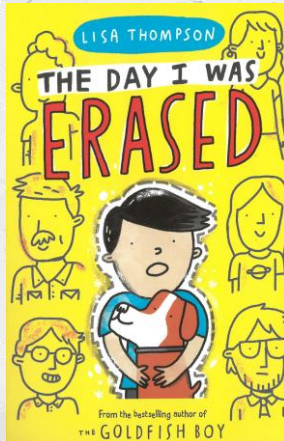
Summer Year 6



English

Children will learn to write engaging stories using descriptive and imaginative language to bring characters and settings to life. They will practice explaining ideas clearly using paragraphs, headings and other features, and will edit their work so it is polished and ready to share, making suitable language and structure choices for their audience and purpose.

We are reading...



Computing

This half term in Computing, Year 6 will develop their app programming skills using a text-based language. Children will design, write and debug simple apps, and explore how programs work, solve problems by breaking them into smaller steps.



Maths

During the summer term, Year 6 pupils will be focusing on shape, geometry and ratio, alongside engaging themed projects. These areas will help children apply their maths skills to problem-solving, reasoning and real-life contexts with increasing confidence.

History

Our History topic this term is *Crime and Punishment*. We will explore how crime and punishment have changed over time by studying different historical periods. We will also consider how laws were created, how punishments were enforced and how attitudes towards justice and fairness have evolved throughout history.

Science

This half term in Science, Year 6 will be learning about evolution and inheritance. Children will explore how living things have changed, using fossils as evidence of life from millions of years ago. They will learn how characteristics are passed from parents to offspring, why individuals are not identical, and how plants and animals adapt to their environments, sometimes leading to evolution over time.



Geography

This term, we will be learning about South America, exploring its countries, key physical features such as rivers, mountains and rainforests, and important human features including cities and cultures. We will use maps and images to locate places, compare environments, and develop an understanding of how people live across this diverse continent.



R.E.

This term, we will revisit our learning about Christianity, developing a clearer understanding of key beliefs, values and practices. Children will explore commandments, worship and prayer, honesty and forgiveness, using stories from the Bible alongside discussion and reflection. The focus will be on understanding how Christian values can guide everyday actions and choices.

Music

This term, we will explore music through themes and variations inspired by Pop Art, focusing on rhythm, pulse, singing and creativity. We will then learn about Baroque music, listening to its distinctive style and instruments.



French

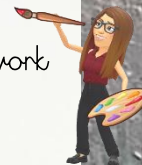
In French, we will be learning about the culture of going to a café in France and how to order food and drinks. They will practise orally explaining items they like and dislike and will create their own French menu.

P.S.H.E.

This term, we will explore Relationships, focusing on wellbeing, online safety and positive communication. We will then move on to Changing Me, learning about growing up, puberty, self-esteem and preparing for secondary school.

Art and D.T.

This term we will focus on food technology, designing and making our own bread as a healthy sports day snack. Children will explore different types of bread through taste testing, learn how ingredients like yeast work, and develop key skills such as weighing, kneading and baking. They will then design and create their own flavoured bread. In Art, we will be creating our own artwork in the style of Andy Warhol.



P.E.

This term, we will take part in a range of PE activities including golf, cricket, running, jumping and throwing, and outdoor activities. These units will help pupils develop their physical skills, fitness, teamwork and problem-solving in a variety of sporting and outdoor contexts.
